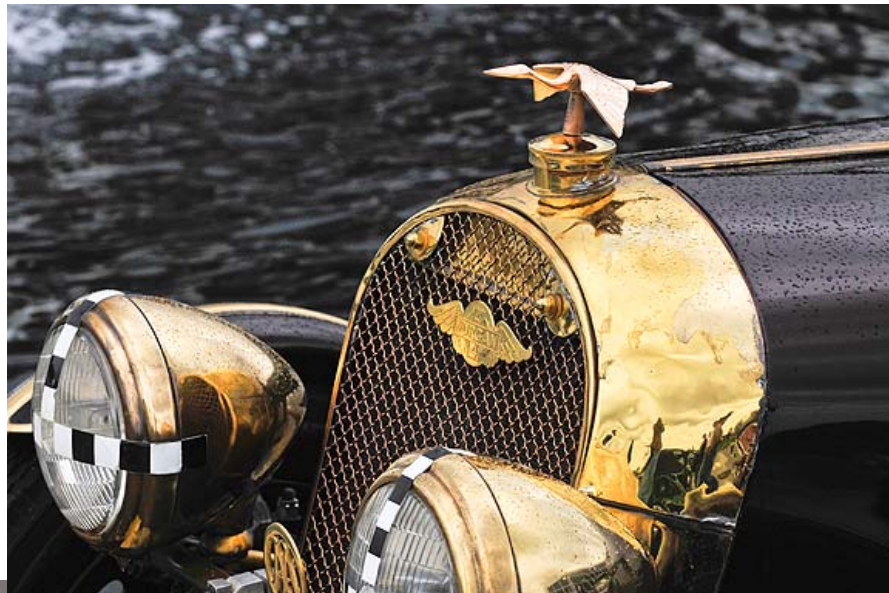
All credit to those brave souls who endured it all and came along. Here is a slide show of the cars and folks at the show. (Hit F11 when you get to it, to make it full screen)
